

## Description of Tasks

**All assignments must be typed unless otherwise noted: TNR, 12 pt, 2x spaced Also, all work must be documented or will receive a zero- yes, a zero.** Plagiarism will not be tolerated and will cost you a zero and other consequences as well. For each task involved you must keep a list of references. Where have you looked? Keep track of websites, articles, etc, researched (even if you don't use them).

### **1. Individual Proposal Paper: the background of your questions (See Handout "Official Proposal, Background Write-up")**

**Draft 1: 30pts Due: \_\_\_\_\_**

Formal write up of your question and what you would like to research for the problem/issue. Your Proposal needs to be written as a question using the criteria discussed in class. Of course your questions will not meet ALL of the criteria we came up with but at the very least it should be provocative (ie. Make us think)

Why are you interested in this? Explain how it fits the theme: "The Global Marketplace." List at least five questions that you know you will have to answer to learn more about this topic such as: Who is working to solve this conflict? What support are they receiving from their government?

**Your writing MUST BE DOCUMENTED. That is, you must be able to show where you got each piece of information used in your write-up. You should list your sources at the end of each paragraph using proper parenthetical citations. Undocumented work will not receive credit.**

### **2. Discovery Poster: Draft 1: 25 pts Due \_\_\_\_\_ Final: 100 pts Due \_\_\_\_\_**

Read the description of the poster on the handout we give you. We are recommending foam core board as opposed to poster board unless you use a three-paneled board (like used for science projects). If you cannot get foam board, let us know and we will try to arrange getting it for you.

Your first draft needs to be a layout of your poster and what will be included in each section. Also, color choices, background framing, etc. You don't have to have every bit of info that will go on your poster but know what will be contained in each "frame" and a definite idea of layout. You may use butcher paper to approximate size and pencil and colored pencil for color scheme.

**Final Draft needs to include items listed on handout.**

### **3. Individual Solution Paper- the Answer to Your Questions- (See "Official Solution")**

**Draft 1: 50 pts Due \_\_\_\_\_ Final: 100 pts Due \_\_\_\_\_**

You need to combine your Individual Proposal Paper with a detailed description of your solution. You must describe the problem and outline your solution, piece by piece. Some of this may be written in paragraph format and other parts could be written as a list of solutions. You should take into consideration the following when writing up your solution paper.

- a. Is your solution to your big question practical and/or feasible?
- b. Has this solution been used elsewhere in the world successfully?
- c. Who will need to take action in order to make your idea a reality? (The government, private companies, world organizations, volunteers?) What will it cost?\*

- d. Describe the impact your solution will have at various levels (impact on individuals, businesses, the government, foreign governments, trade partners, the world market...)
- e. How will this program be implemented and how long will this program take to implement?

### **3.5 Bibliography: due with Proposal and Solution (Drafts and Final)**

You must turn in a complete Bibliography each time you turn in work. This goes for all written work (including what you use on your Discovery Poster.) Undocumented work will not receive credit.

### **4. Presentation Proposal and Explanation: Draft 1: 20 pts Due \_\_\_\_\_**

**Your “Final” will be your presentation, either in front of a community panel, or at Project Night.**

For this assignment, please read the handout we give to you. You must decide on what type of presentation you will use. PowerPoint may ONLY be used as an addition to your presentation. Examples of presentations are (but not limited to): A dramatization, a game show, a mock trial, a formal presentation (standard type used in class), a forum (like the United Nations), a “mock” congress situation of another country trying to pass a law, a newscast, a “town meeting” etc. In this explanation, you will be explaining to us WHAT you are going to do and HOW you are going to do it. Step by step. Also, you need to include an estimate of how long your presentation will be. It should be between 10-15 minutes (max.)

### **6. Presentation Script, Text, etc. Draft 1: 20pts. Due \_\_\_\_\_. No final on this. Your final will be your presentation.**

For this assignment you must write up your actual script. You must write out what everyone is going to say and do- (just like a screenplay). You must write it like a script and explain who will do what, what they will say, etc. Include any props, equipment, etc.

### **7. Dress Rehearsals of Presentation Final: 25 pts. X 2 Due \_\_\_\_\_**

For this assignment, you will present your presentation twice. The first run through will be for another group in your TIC on 2/28/07. The dress rehearsal for the entire TIC will start 3/5/07. You will do your presentation exactly how you will do it for the Final Presentation. The dress rehearsals are a great chance to get ready for SF, as well for your presentation which will take place in March.

### **8. Final Presentation: 100 pts. Due: READY to present by \_\_\_\_\_. Your team needs to be ready to go!!!**

This is your chance to present your project in all its glory ☺. You will need to “dress the part”, have all preparations ready to go and present to the team. You will receive a rubric for this presentation so that you will know what is expected of you.

## **Individual Assignment for Global Challenge**

1. **Paper:** Follow format we give you in class. Write a 3-5 page paper on the topic of your choice. You must choose a topic that has to do with Conflict in the Contemporary World, with a science emphasis. In the paper you need to discuss what you are studying, what you have learned and what you think the possible solution(s) to the problem might be. (Make sure to cite your sources.)
2. **Poster.** You need to create a poster (poster board size) to present your problem/issue. Look at the directions for the Discovery Poster that were handed out and follow those to a smaller degree.
3. **Presentation:** Present your findings to the class. You may do this creatively or as a standard presentation. You need to explain to us what you researched, what you found out and what you would do about it.

**Due dates: same as everyone else in the class. You will do all of assignments, including presentations.**

Your work will be weighted so that it is of equal value as those working in the group. You are doing the work alone but you are also doing less work in theory than those in a group.

**All work must be documented with sources. All work must be typed and double-spaced. Make sure to continue to turn in your individual assignments.**
