Recommended Team Schedule (8 weeks)

December- January	-Find students interested in participating in the World Affairs Challenge and form a team(s) of up to 12 students (if you have more than 12 students, please form more than one team-World Savvy can assist in recruitment, if needed)	Week #4	-Decide on your team's Presentation format. -Assign roles and writing assignments. Identify any "gaps" in your research to date and assign research tasks.
Week # 1	-Introduce the annual theme with your team and brainstorm topics. -Introduce the 4 events. -Run through several sample quiz questions (<i>provided by World Savvy</i>). Decide on strategy for preparing for quiz. Send students home asking them to identify a "top pick" for a research topic, and their #1 reason for choosing it.	Week #5	-Work on Formal Presentation. -More quiz practice. -Decide whether to create the optional Discovery Poster.
Week #2	-Finalize topic and discuss various formats for the Formal Presentation. -Continue preparing for the Global Awareness Quiz. -Send students home asking them to do an internet search and read and print one article pertaining to the theme.	Week #6	-Finish writing Presentation; rehearse. -Make photocopies for students to practice at home. - Begin to design your Discovery Poster. (Optional) - Discuss strategies for Collaborative Question. - Have students make or find props at home.
Week #3	- Discuss the articles and begin to identify the "players" in this issue. Who wins? Who loses? Look at the issue from the perspective of each side. Begin to discuss solutions.	Week #7	-Rehearse skit. -Quiz Preparation. -Finish Discovery Poster. (Optional)
		Week #8	-Dress rehearsal for Presentation, including setup and take down. -Remind students about Collaborative Question. -Final Quiz practice.

Recommended Team Schedule (12 weeks)

November/December -Find students interested in participating in the World Affairs Challenge and form a team(s) of up to 12 students (if you have more than 12 students, please form more than one team-World Savvy can assist in recruitment, if needed)

Weeks #1 & #2 -Introduce the 4 events and scoring criteria with your team.
-Introduce the annual theme with your team and brainstorm topics.
-Send students home asking them to do research on theme.

Week #3 -Finalize topic and discuss various formats for the Formal presentation.
-Decide on your team's Presentation format.
-Decide on strategy for preparing for quiz.
-Run through sample quiz questions (*provided by World Savvy*).

Weeks #4, #5 & #6 -Research the selected topic and assign roles and assignments.
-Do more preparation for the Global Awareness Quiz.

Week #7, #8 & #9 -Write Formal Presentation and make copies for students to take home and start memorizing
- More quiz practice.

Week #10 -Gather props, sets, and costumes for Formal Presentation.
-Begin to design your Discovery Poster.
-Start preparing for Collaborative Question.

Week #11 -Finish all props, sets, and costumes. Run through presentation.
-Finish Discovery Poster.

Week #12 -Dress rehearsal for Presentation, including setup and take down.
-Remind students about Collaborative Question.
-Final Quiz practice.
